



The main benefits of connecting sweeping industry data and stormwater professionals

The main benefits of connecting the sweeping industry with stormwater professionals include:

- 1. Ability of the stormwater community to understand the improved pollution removal that may be obtained given their budget: Solid studies on street sweeping have shown street sweeping to be 5-7 times more cost-effective than catch basin cleaning for removing pollutants like nitrogen and phosphorus.
- 2. **Data-driven decision making**: Collaboration can lead to better testing and evaluation of sweeper performance, allowing stormwater managers to make informed choices about equipment and programs.
- 3. **Regulatory credits**: With better data and understanding, regulators can develop more accurate credit systems for street sweeping programs within MS4 permits.
- 4. **Cost savings**: Effective sweeping programs can reduce the need for downstream stormwater infrastructure maintenance and treatment.
- 5. **Addressing emerging pollutants**: Sweeping can help tackle issues like microplastics and tire wear particles, which are becoming increasingly concerning.





- 6. **Holistic stormwater management**: Integrating sweeping into overall stormwater programs can create more comprehensive and effective pollution control strategies.
- 7. **Funding opportunities**: Increased awareness of sweeping's benefits could lead to more communities accessing federal funding for sweepers through programs like the Clean Water State Revolving Fund.
- 8. **Technology advancement**: Collaboration can drive innovation in sweeper design and operation to better address stormwater management needs.
- 9. **Enhanced program effectiveness**: Sharing best practices on topics like vehicle removal during sweeping can improve overall program performance.
- Better public understanding: Improved communication between sectors can help educate the public on the importance of street sweeping for water quality.
